UN declared 2nd October as an 'INTERNATIONAL NON-VIOLENCE DAY'

SUGGESTED PROGRAMMES for Schools & Colleges

INTRODUCTION

United Nations General Assembly declared 2nd October (Gandhi Jayanti) as an 'International Day of Non-Violence' in 2007. It is a real tribute to the apostle of Peace. The day is meant to raise awareness of non-violence, tolerance, full respect for all human rights and fundamental freedoms for all, democracy, development, mutual understanding and respect of diversity through education and public awareness.

Never before has there been so much speculation about the future of this world as it is in today's violent times. Youth today is indiscriminately bombarded with negative emotions of selfishness, hatred, vengeance and violence through T.V, films, mobile phones and video games. As a result, news of children taking to violence at slightest disagreements or conflicts appears more frequently in newspapers. Therefore, Value Education has become the need of the hour to sustain morality and peaceful conflict resolution.

Gandhiji has been a source of inspiration for international personalities like Martin Luther King (Jr.), Nelson Mandela, Barak Obama and now Anna Hazare and his movement against corruption, just as innumerable other common men and women who look towards the life and teachings of Gandhi for moral inspiration.

Theme: From Non-Violence to Humanity (अहिंसा से मानवता तक)

A series of action programmes for Schools & Colleges for the week is attached for perusal.

During this week-long national education initiative, various activities will demonstrate the positive role young people can have in making their schools and communities safer. Each day of the week will focus on a specific nonviolent strategy. These include promoting respect, tolerance, anger management, resolving conflicts peacefully, and uniting in action.

- 1) Maximum students of city Colleges & Schools, NSS, NCC, Scout & Guide may gather at play-ground or stadium. One hour Programme may start with **Gandhi bhajan & peace songs**, followed by a speech by prominent persons. The Programme will end with a **Pledge of Non-Violence** administered by the Chief Guest followed by National anthem. (Copy of the PLEDGE is attached herewith.)

- 3) Youth Camps, Seminars, Workshops & Lectures on Non-violence, Peace & Gandhi
- 4) Exams on books of Peace, Non-violence and non-violent leaders like Gandhi, Nelson Mandela & Martin Luther King Jr. etc.
- 5) Exhibition-cum-sale of books on Non-violence & Mahatma Gandhi (*available with Bombay Sarvodaya Mandal for sale*)
- 6) Poster Exhibition on life & works of Mahatma Gandhi (*available with Bombay Sarvodaya Mandal for sale*)
- 7) Screening of the films on Non-violence and Mahatma Gandhi (*available with Bombay Sarvodaya Mandal for sale*)
- 8) Observe 2nd October as a 'KHADI DAY' in colleges.
- 9) Publish articles in Newspaper on Peace & Non-violence and relevance of Gandhi
- 10) Peace March (प्रभात फेरी) in surrounding areas with banners & slogans of Peace & Non-violence
- 11) Cleanliness drive (Shramadan) in public places like Bus-Railway Station, slum areas etc.

As a result, news of children taking to violence at slightest disagreements or conflicts appears more frequently in newspapers. We have achieved milestone in academic field for our children but have failed to add an inch to the moral heights of mankind. In such a situation it has become inevitable to inculcate moral values in the younger minds as children are like clay in a potter's hand which with care and responsibility can be moulded into compassionate humans, understanding true moral values.

We are happy to note that we got an overwhelming response to our call to celebrate Gandhi Jayanti with renewed vigour. Colleges in different states organised various events on 2nd October. Students and teachers participated enthusiastically in these celebrations and about three to four lakh students participated in these programmes.

We are filled with joy to see that even today; Gandhi is remembered in all solemnity in the society. We are presenting here some reports of the programmes organised in India and at International level.

• BOMBAY SARVODAYA MANDAL & UNIVERSITY OF MUMBAI



"...I shall endeavour to resolve all differences through dialogue and constitutional means and I shall strive to establish world peace", about 525 NSS students from 70 colleges of University of Mumbai joined hands with the millions of people all over the world and took the pledge on International Non-violence Day, 2nd October 2010.

To commemorate 141st birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi and an International Non-Violence Day, University of Mumbai and Bombay Sarvodaya Mandal had jointly organized a programme at Vidyapith Vidyarthi Bhavan, Mumbai on 2nd October. The main theme of this programme was to raise awareness for non-violence, tolerance, respect, human rights and fundamental freedom for all, mutual understanding and respect of diversity among the young generation.

Bombay Sarvodaya Mandal have organized Gandhi Peace Exam in Arthur Road Jail and Thane Central Jail in the last week of September to commemorate 141st Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Orientation lectures were organized before the exam. About 60 jail inmates from Arthur Road Jail and 100 inmates from Thane Central Jail appeared in the exam. **Eminent Gandhian Tushar Gandhi presided over the function.**

University Of Mumbai celebrated International Non-violence Day with Work Publicity Week from 24th September to 2nd October. With other competitions, Poster Competition on peace and non-violence on 28th of September and Anti-Alcoholism and awareness campaigns. The competitions were conducted at three levels: college, district and university. On 2nd October a programme was conducted including Prayer, Bhajans, Peace songs, Speeches of NSS officials and a pledge for peace and Non-Violence more than 15000 copies of Gandhiji's autobiography 'My Experiments with Truth' were sold by management students of Mumbai, Pune and Hyderabad and about 45000 students from Mumbai and Maharashtra appeared for Gandhi Peace Exam in month of October.

- **S.K.N. Medical College, Pune** observed the 'International Non Violence week from 2nd to 10th October 2010. Posters competition highlighting various aspects of Non Violence and peace, taking ceremony, film shows on personal hygiene, sanitation, safe motherhood and female foeticide, inauguration of rural health training centre and other programmes were conducted.



- **J.E.S. Mahavidyalaya, Jalna** celebrated Gandhi Jayanti by organizing a state level Gandhi Vichar shibir from 12 November 2010.
- **Vidya Vikas Education society Vikhroli** started **Gandhian study centre** on 5th October 2010.

- **National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE)** promoted Gandhiji's Autobiography 'My Experiments with Truth' among corporate, students and youth through launching 'Shanti Eva Jayate' a national campaign based on Gandhian Principles of self Reliance and Holistic personality. Similar campaigns were held in Pune and Hyderabad also.

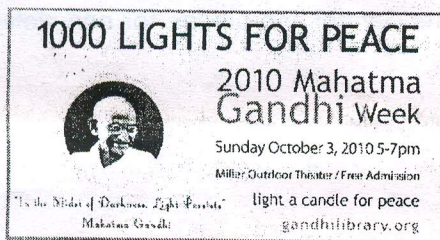

- **Canada:** In Hamilton the 18th Annual Gandhi peace march, free food and music. The theme was power of Non Violence.



Board approved October as a month of emphasizing peace.

- **Gandhi Centre, Australia :** With the help of local city council Gandhi Centre, Skokie villages' Gandhi Memorial Trust celebrated the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi the 'Father of the nation by meeting at the statue of Mahatma Gandhi. They invited representatives of different communities and light up the lamp giving short message of peace. Skokie Public Library hostel a panel discussion on Non Violence on October 5. Skokie village Board approved October as a month of emphasizing peace.
- **The Mahatma Gandhi Foundation** hosted the first festival of Non Violence in Madelyn. 500 people rallied and lit candles near the Biblioteca Espaa, Medelin Bearing candles and wearing Gandhi masks, the crowd marched to reject violence. The life-size cardboard cutouts with quotes of Mahatma Gandhi were displayed. The festival ended with music, dance and prayer.
- **The Valley Interfaith Council** hosted the 15th annual Gandhi Day celebration on October. at Canoga park, Canada. The theme was 'Be the change you want to see in the world.' The events were lectures, devotional Indian music, Classical dance and a Skit an interview with Mahatma Gandhi.
- **Parramatta City Libraries** in coordination with Gandhi Peace Centre Australia is organising a world long celebration of Mahatma Gandhi's 141st birth anniversary with exhibition of posters and books on Mahatma Gandhi's life. Prominent person from Gandhi Peace Centre spoke about Mahatma Gandhi's life and values.
- **Gandhi International Institute for Peace** commemorated an event to honor Mahatma Gandhi on October 2 in Waikiki Honolulu. Over 400 people attended the celebration and enjoyed the multicultural dances, spiritual chanting, yoga demonstration and speeches free food was donated by ISKCON temple.
- **Student of Ideal Indian School, Doha Peninsula** celebrated Gandhi's birthday as the International Day for peace and Non Violence. Special events were inter-house Poster display depicting the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi, Nelson Mandela and Martin Luther king. Students demonstrated a slid show on importance of Gandhian principles in the present century and a documentary film on Gandhi was shown.
- **In Huston,** 1000 lights for peace were lit on 3rd October. In context of Gandhi Jayanti Day, The children museum opens its doors for Mahatma Gandhi Library. Various artists performed to commemorate heroes that stood for peace. A photographic exhibition of Mahatma Gandhi and a peace march was held. A show of the film 'The Force more powerful' about the Non Violence resistance movements of the 20th century was organized. Tribute speeches contests were organized for students.



College of Education, Barshi, Dist. Solapur organized Gandhi Jayanti week from 2nd to 9th October 2010. The events included were rally, cleaning campaign, talks, essay competition, film show and exhibition.

- **Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Karad** celebrated the 'Ahimsa Mas'- a month dedicated to Non violence. The events were shramdan, Essay competition, posters competition, slogan competition, patriotic songs workshop and environment protection.
- **Ratnagiri Sub-centre, Mumbai University** celebrated Gandhi Saptah from 2nd to 8th October 2010 by arranging lectures of renounced persons in different aspects of life.
