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Profile of the Department....

Ya Kriyawan Sa Pandita (learned person is one who is ceaselessly active) is the motto of the Savitribai Phule Pune University(then Poona University), which is established in 1949. Since its inception, the University has put objective of 'Social Commitment' while attaining excellence in higher education. The University Grants Commission (UGC) accepted 'Extension' as the important dimension of higher education besides Teaching and Research. In the Policy document (1977) the UGC states, "If the University system has to discharge adequately its responsibilities to the entire educational system and to the society as a whole, it must accept extension as the third important responsibility and give it the same status as research and teaching. This is a new and extremely significant area, which should be developed on the basis of high priority". These two noble principles i.e. social commitment (by the University) and development of the Department (by the UGC) are the source for emergence and Extension. Along with several community oriented activities, Continuing Education Programme was started in the University in 1972 with the objectives of social awakening & sensitization and imparting need based courses to various groups in the society. It was the beginning of the Department. Through Continuing Education, several programmes were implemented such as,

- Skill Development Courses.
- Courses for income generation.
- In-service training programmes.
- Hobby Courses.
- Programmes for social awareness.
- Programmes for enhancement in particular field.
- Programmes for interaction of community with students from University & Colleges.

The Continuing Education programme which was innovative in nature was successful in strengthening bonds of higher education with society. The historically important UGC policy of 1977 was followed the National Adult Education Programme (NAEP), which was introduced by the Government of India. The Department was actively involved in the implementation of NAEP. It became very successful and popular, through which the involvement of people in general and students volunteers got increased on large scale. It also sought and participation of Non-Government Organizations, Voluntary Agencies, Government Department,

mass media and individuals on large scale. Spreading of 'Social Awareness', inculcation of 'Functionality' and imparting 'Literacy Skills' were the objectives of NAEP. Gradually the nature of Adult Education programme got changed according to UGC guidelines. However the Department was always at the forefront is implementing Adult Education Programme on massive scale at rural, tribal and urban communities. The scope of the programme got widened and it became a movement of committed youth for spread of literacy along with social transformation. Several success stories of Social Enlightenment and Mass Awareness came up. Both press & electronic media highlighted some of the endeavours. Village Development Programmes were organized at colleges.

Two other programmes were added.

- Planning Forum (PF).
- Population Education Club Programme (PEC).

The objective of planning forum was to acquaint the students with the planning process from home to nation. Population Education Club Programme aimed to sensitise the students regarding growth of population and the imbalance in resource utilization. The UGC bestowed the responsibility of Population Education Resource Centre (PERC) on Department. It was expected from PERC to provide academic support to PECs in Maharashtra state (Excluding Mumbai). In 1989-90 the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension integrated following programmes under one umbrella.

- ❖ Adult Education (AE)
- Continuing Education (CE)
- Population Education (PEC)

Jana Shikshan Nilayams (JSN) were set up as 'Community Centers'. This activity was linked to AE, PEC, & CE. This 'Area Development Approach' was introduced by UGC. Mass Programme for Functional Literacy (MPFL) was another innovative programme which was undertaken by the Department. Existing Centre-based Adult Education Programme was supported with MPEL. The approach of MPEL was 'Each One Teach Group'.

According to the National Policy, Total Literacy Campaign (TLC) was implemented throughout the country. Pune District (Rural) TLC was one of the intial programme. The Department involved in this Programme with full vigour. The Vice-Chancellor of University of Pune was the chairman of Pune (Rural) TLC.

The Department sought assistance from University departments, Colleges and individuals too. The Department performed important role in it through its contribution in programme planning, environment building, programme execution, carried out supportive activities, evaluation & post literacy Programme. The Department involved in other TLC programmes. Besides UGC programme, the Department implements other programmes with the help of NGOs, V/As & Government departments.

Teaching Programme:

Kargil Operation & Gujrat earthquake: Massive Blood Donation Drives:

The Department organised & coordinated massive blood donation drives (during 19991-2001) in coordination with Armed force Medical College, Pune to provide blood for the Indian Army Jawans of Kargil operation & Gujrat earthquake affected people. Total 670, volunteers from 12 Colleges had participated in the blood donation camp. Apart from this, the Department also Conducted literacy centre for the wives of Army Jawans at CME, Dapodi, Pune. Annual Report for the year 2014-15: by Faculty Members विवाहपूर्व समुपदेशन

प्रस्तावना

सावित्रीबाई फुले पुणे विद्यापीठाच्या प्रौढ, निरंतर शिक्षण व ज्ञानविस्तार विभागाच्या मार्फत महाविद्यालयांमधून विविध विषयांवर एकदिवशीय कार्यशाळा घेतल्या जातात. सन २०१४-१५ या वर्षापासून महाविद्यालयीन विद्यार्थ्यांसाठी विवाहपूर्व समुपदेशन कार्यशाळा हा उपक्रम आठ महाविद्यालयांतून पथदर्शी प्रकल्प म्हणून राबवण्यात आला. महाविद्यालयांमधून कार्यशाळांचे आयोजन करण्यात आले होते. तज्ञ साधन व्यक्तींची यादी महाविद्यालयांना देण्यात आली होती. यासाठी समुपदेशक श्रीमती अश्विनी तांबे यांचे सहकार्य लाभले. या शिवाय महाविद्यालय स्तरावर एक आणि वस्तीस्तरावर एक अशी दोन समुपदेशन केंद्र सुरु केली. विद्यार्थी आणि विविध समाजघटकांनी समुपदेशन केंद्राचा लाभ घेतला.

उपक्रमाचा उद्देश

विवाहाची संकल्पना आणि पद्धती काळानुसार बदलत आहेत. विवाह कसा, कोणाशी याचबरोबर कशाला करायचा हे प्रश्न तस्ण पिढी विचारत आहे. प्रेम आणि आकर्षण, प्रेमाला घरच्यांचा विरोध म्हणून घरातून पळून जाणे या गोष्टी सतत ऐकायला मिळतात. विवाहात जोडीदाराबरोबर आयुष्याच्या गाठी बांधल्या जातात हा विचार मागे पडून जमेल तेवढे दिवस निभवायचे ही मानसिकता वाढते आहे. शहराबरोबर ग्रामीण भागातील घटस्फोटांचे प्रमाण वाढत असल्याचे जाणवते. विवाह झाल्यावर प्रश्न निर्माण होण्यापेक्षा विवाह करण्याआधी जोडीदार कसा असावा व विवाहातून मला काय साध्य होणार व कुठे तडजोड करावी लागणार आहे; याचा विचार झाला असल्यास विवाहानंतर येणाऱ्या अडचणींना सामोरे जाणे व त्यातून मार्ग काढणे सोपे होऊ शकेल या उद्देशाने महाविद्यालयांतून कार्यशाळांचे आयोजन केले होते. या कार्यशाळा एकूण आठ संलग्न महाविद्यालयात आयोजित केल्या होत्या. दोन दिवशीय अर्धवेळ कार्यशाळा ज्यात एकूण चार तज्ञ व्यक्तींकडून विद्यार्थ्यांना मार्गदर्शन व चर्चा असे कार्यक्रमाचे स्वस्प होते. विविध महाविद्यालयांमधून ७२७ विद्यार्थी कार्यशाळेत सहभागी झाले होते. विवाहाचा विचार सुरु होत असताना प्रामुख्याने तस्ण - तस्णींसाठी ज्या गोष्टींचा विचार करणे नितांत आवश्यक आहे किंवा ज्या बाबत त्यांना माहिती आणि मार्गदर्शन पाहिजे अशा खालील चार विषयांचा समावेश कार्यशाळेत केला होता.

- स्वओळख.
- जोडीदार निवडताना ठेवायच्या अपेक्षा आणि विवाहासाठीची माहिती.
- विवाहानंतर कराव्या लागणाऱ्या बदलांचा स्विकार.
- विवाहासंबंधीत कायदे.

विवाहाबाबत मार्गदर्शन करण्याचा उपक्रम महाविद्यालयीन पातळीवर कार्यशाळांमार्फत पहिल्यांदाच घेतला गेलेला आहे याची मुला मुलींना वाटलेली उपयुक्तता व कार्यशाळेची परिणामकारकता पाहण्याच्या दृष्टीने ३९१ विद्यार्थ्याकडून मूल्यमापन फॉर्म भरुन घेतले.

कार्यशाळेत सहभागी होण्यात विद्यार्थीनींचा सहभाग अधिक होता. ३९१ सहभागी विद्यार्थ्यांमध्ये ३३० मुली (८४.३%) व मुले (१५.६%) असल्याचे दिसून आले. विवाहानंतर मुलापेक्षा मुलीला जास्त बदलांना सामोरे जावे लागते, त्यामुळे सदर कार्यशाळा ह्या मुलींनाच जास्त आवश्यक आहेत, अशी मानसिकता आढळून आली. प्रत्यक्षात विवाहासाठी मुला -मुलींना दोघांना स्वओळख आणि त्यानुसार जोडीदार निवड करणे आवश्यक आहे. तसेच विवाहानंतर अनेक बदलांना, नात्यातील बदलांना दोघांनाही सामोरे जावे लागते; ज्यामुळे त्यांचे वैवाहिक जीवनात एकमेकांना समजावून घेत असतानाच नाती आणि रुढी परंपरांना सांभाळताना संघर्ष होऊ शकतो. ज्या मुलांनी कार्यशाळेत सहभाग घेतला होता त्या मुलांच्या मूल्यमापनपत्रात नाती आणि रुढी परंपरा अशा विषयांची जाणीव करून घ्यायच्या बाबत मुलांनी आवश्यकता दर्शवली आहे.

ज्या महाविद्यालयातून कार्यशाळा घेतल्या गेल्या तेथील विद्यार्थी - विद्यार्थीनींना विवाहपूर्व समुपदेशन हा विषय पूर्णपणे नविन होता. त्यामुळे या कार्यशाळेतून काय ऐकायला मिळणार याची उत्सुकता जाणवली.

या कार्यशाळेत हाताळले वा चर्चिले गेलेले विषय हे विद्यार्थ्यांच्या मनातील प्रश्नांना काही प्रमाणात उत्तरे देऊन गेली. व्याख्यानानंतर असणा-या प्रश्नोत्तराच्या वेळात काही मुले प्रश्न विचारत होती तर काही जण कागदावर प्रश्न लिहून देत होते. यात विवाहसंदर्भातील अनेक प्रश्न असायचे. जसे की विवाह करायलाच पाहिजे पासून एखादा मुलगा मागे लागला आहे त्याचे प्रेम खरे कि खोटे ते कसे पडताळून पहायचे किंवा आईवडील लग्नासाठी मागे लागले आहेत त्यांना कसे समजवायचे या सारखे प्रश्न विद्यार्थ्यांनी उपस्थित केले.

विवाहानंतर मुलींनाच तडजोड करायला लागणार आणि बदल स्विकारायला लागणार आहेत अशी कार्यशाळेत सहभागी झालेल्या मुलांची मानसिकता जाणवली. पण कार्यशाळा संपल्यावर मात्र विवाहाविषयी नवीन दृष्टी मिळाल्याचे अनेकजणांनी सांगितले.

ग्रामीण भागातील काही महाविद्यालयातील विद्यार्थीनी विवाहित तसेच लग्न ठरलेल्या होत्या. त्यांना शिक्षण घ्यायलाच अनेक अडथळे येत असल्याचे जाणवले. त्यांना ठामपणे शिक्षण घेण्यासाठी प्रयत्न करावा आणि ताणाला सामोरे जावे याबाबत मार्गदर्शन करण्याची आवश्यकता आहे.

कार्यशाळा पुणे शहर, पुणे ग्रामीण, नाशिक व अहमदनगर अशा विविध ठिकाणी घेतल्या होत्या. जिथे महाविद्यालयीन वातावरण व वेगवेगळया पार्श्वभूमीतील विद्यार्थी - विद्यार्थीनी असले तरी त्यांच्याबाबतचे प्रश्न बरेच सारखे होते. प्रेमप्रकरणे, मुला - मुलींचे पळून जाणे, मुलींची लग्न लवकर करुन देणे. मुलींची छेड काढली जाणे व त्याबाबत मुलींनाच दोषी ठरवून त्यांचे शिक्षण बंद होणे.

ग्रामीण भागात एखादी मुलगी मुलाबरोबर पळून गेली की घरातील व गावातील होणारे वाद यामुळे ही महाविद्यालयातील कर्मचारीवर्गाला ताण सहन करावा लागतो. ब-याचवेळा या मुलींच्या मैत्रिणींचे ही शिक्षण बंद केले जाउन त्यांची लग्न करन दिली जातात.

स्वओळख ही संकल्पना विद्यार्थ्यांमध्ये रुजवणे केवळ विवाहासाठीच नाही, तर चांगले आयुष्य जगण्यासाठी महत्वाचे वाटते. याबाबत काही अधिकाधिक सत्र मुलांसाठी व्हायला हवीत हे जाणवले.

मुलांना अनेक वैयक्तिक प्रश्न असल्याचे जाणवले. ज्यासाठी तज्ञ व्यक्ती किंवा किमान ज्यांच्याशी ते मोकळेपणाने बोलतील व मार्गदर्शन घेतील अशांबरोबर त्यांचा संवाद वारंवार घडणे आवश्यक आहे. त्यासाठी समुपदेशन केंद्र महाविद्यालय स्तरावर निर्माण झाली पाहिजेत असे समुपदेशक श्रीमती अश्विनी तांबे यांनी सुचिवले.

सावित्रीबाई फुले पुणे विद्यापीठाच्या नियोजन आणि विकास विभागामार्फतच्या नाशिक जिल्हयातील आदिवासी महाविद्यालयांच्या यादी प्रमाणे नाशिक येथील उपकेंद्रात गुरुवार, दि. २९ जानेवारी २०१५ रोजी आदिवासी महाविद्यालयांकरीता प्राचार्यांसमवेत सहविचार सभा आयोजित केली होती. अध्यक्षस्थानी नाशिक जिल्हा विद्यापीठ उपकेंद्राचे समन्वयक डॉ. रावसाहेब शिंदे होते. नाशिक येथील समाजकार्य महाविद्यालयाचे प्राचार्य डॉ. विलास देशमुख हे प्रमुख पाहुणे म्हणून उपस्थित होते.सुरूवातीला डॉ. रावसाहेब शिंदे यांनी उपस्थितांचे उपकेंद्राचे समन्वयक या नात्याने स्वागत केले; आणि ज्ञानविस्ताराच्या कार्यक्रमात मोठया प्रमाणात सहभागी व्हावे असे आवाहन केले. त्यानंतर प्रौढ, निरंतर शिक्षण व ज्ञानविस्तार विभागाचे संचालक डॉ. धनंजय लोखंडे यांनी सहविचार सभेचा हेतू आणि भूमिका स्पष्ट केली.

b) Seminars, Workshops etc. organized-

b.1) State level seminar on 'Samajik Vastav ani Sahitya' on May 13, 2014, in memory of Dr. Bhalchandra Phadke-

This seminar was organized in the memory of Dr. Bhalchandra Phadke. Dr. Phadke was the first Director of this Department. He was instrumental in imbibing 'social commitment' aspect in the Department. The Department believes in bringing about social transformation through education & enlightenment of people. Emphasis is given to several socially deprived groups. The seeds of such progressive thoughts were sown by Dr. Bhalchandra Phadke. In memory of Dr. Phadke, each year generally on May 13 (birth anniversary of Dr.Phadke), any one programme is organized by the Department. Persons from adult education, literature and social activists participate in such programme with vigor. This year a seminar entitled 'Samajik Vastav ani Sahitya' (Social Realities and Literature) was organized by the Department in collaboration with Dalit Sahitya Parishad (an organization working for promotion of literature in downtrodden communities) on May 13,2014. Eminent writer Shri. Rajan Khan inaugurated the seminar. Smt. Lata Choudhari (ex-faculty member from the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension) presided the function. Initially Director & Head of the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension Dr. Dhananjay Lokhande welcomed all. In his speech, he clarified the extension work being carried out by the Department. Dr.Satish Shirsath put forward the objectives of the seminar. In an inaugural address, Rajan Khan emphasized the role of literature to sketch the realities in society. Dr. Raja Dixit (member of the Board of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, University of Pune) stated the need for enlightenment of people through literature. Smt. Lata Choudhari, in presidential address stated how adult education can promote for social harmony and social wellbeing in total. Shri. Bal Alhat and Smt. b.2) International Seminar entitled 'Social Inequalities in Higher Education : Identifying Parallels in India & Brazil' on May 23-24, 2014-

An International Seminar as mentioned above was organized by the Department on May 23-24, 2014. Education is considered a powerful tool to bring about social transformation and entire wellbeing. In Indian context, the higher education has been flourished in quantity. However some social groups such as SCs, STs, women, minorities, etc. are far behind so far the participation and getting benefitted such groups from highereducation. Especially the specialized higher education is quite inaccessible for such groups. Brazil is a country from Latin America, though differs in several aspects from India faces parallel problems. Many non-white persons are away from higher education there. Some affirmative measures are proposed& executed at government level in both the countries.

To discuss relevant issues in this regard, an international seminar was scheduled and conducted by the Department. It was inaugurated at the hands of veteran social thinker Shri. Bhai Vaidya.

Day 1:

In the beginning Dr. Dhananjay Lokhande welcomed all the dignitaries and participants. In welcome speech he unfolded the extension work in both countries to face the problem of less involvement of certain social groups. Dr.Satish Shirsath stated the objectives as well as schedule of the seminar. He appealed the participants to make this seminar more & more interactive through their active involvement.

Three related books were released in the inaugural function;

- 1. Compendium of Abstracts(of the seminar),
- 2. Extension Education in India,
- 3. Contemplations of Extension in Higher Education.

Shri. Bhai Vaidya, Dr. S. C. Bhatia (President,Indian University Association for Continuing Education), Prof. M. Gulrez (Director, Centre for South African & Brazilian Studies, Aligarh Muslim university), Dr. Aparajita Gangopadhyay (Director, Centre for Latin American Studies, Goa University) in their lectures unfolded several aspects regarding the seminar. They all appealed to try to involve all types of people, especially the disadvantageous persons in higher education's that they can be self-reliant and can have personality development too. Dr. Gautam Bhong (Dean of Faculty of Mental,Moral & Social Sciences, University of Pune) in his presidential address, expressed the need to carry out studies among developing and underdeveloped countries so far educational achievements in them is concerned. He stressed to achieve more and more participation of disadvantaged groups in education and governance. Dr. P. V. Gupta proposed vote of thanks for the inaugural function.

The inaugural function was followed by a key note address by Pro. M. Gulrez. His topic was-Higher Education and policies of Social inclusion in Brazil. In a plenary session, Dr. Aparajita Gangoaadhyay talked on 'Gender Discrimination and Education; Pre Observations'; while Dr. Dilip Chavan talked on Status of Marginalized Sections in education: Causes and Remedies'. In view of memorizing it and propagating it unto various sections of the society & youth, the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension from Savitribai Phule Pune University has initiated an ambitious programme- Constitution Literacy & Honour Campaign. As its part, the Department organized some activities such as,

- -Sensitization lectures for college youth.
- -Awareness programmes at communities & at NGOs.
- -Reading preamble of the constitution in the Republic day ceremony (on January 26, 2015).

In view of constructing conceptual and academic foundation, the Department organized a state level seminar on Constitution Literacy &Honour Campaign. Total 65 persons (academicians, social workers, researchers, teachers from university and colleges, representatives of NGOs) participated in it. Proceeding of the seminar:

- 2.2 community.

More than 13 different areas have been evolved by the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & extension in view of extension activities i.e. unorganized workers, women empowerment, senior citizens, national integration, NGOs, etc. Along with innovations in topics / areas the department promotes to adopt new/innovative approaches/strategies for implementation.

Each year, about seventy colleges (from Arts, Commerce, science, Social Work and other professional colleges) are involved in extension activities. The coordinators-colleges teachers at college level, are imparted training regarding nature and implementation strategies. In said training programme, coordinators are acquainted

with norms and guidelines for implementation of activities. Their doubts and queries discussed too.

In 2014-15, such training cum planning meeting (entitled-SAH-VICHAR SABHA) was conveyed on October 01, 2014. Fifty two college teachers participated in it. In the inaugural function, coordinator, Dr. Satish Shirsath clarified the objectives of SAH-VICHAR SABHA. Head of Department & Director Dr. Dhananjay Lokhande welcomed all and put for the work of the department. Key-note address was delivered by Dr. K. N. Bawle. - social responsibility of colleges and extension,

Principal Dr. Manjusree Bobade (member of the board of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, S.P. Pune University) also guided the participants. She appealed the college teachers to get involve in national reconstruction through extension activities. Dr. Vijay Khare unfolded the picture of higher education in India. Consultative Workshop On Curriculum Design In Tribal Development Dr. B. A. Deshmukh

Report on Consultative workshop on 'Curriculum Design in Tribal Development'

Consultative workshop on 'Curriculum Design in Tribal Development' was conducted by the Department of Adult, continuing Education & Extension, Savitribai Phule Pune University, at Pune on 13th August 2014.

Background :-

The University of Pune had approved Diploma in Tribal Development in the year 1981-82 as post-graduate diploma course under the faculty of mental moral and social sciences. Since then none of the Institute or college has been come forward to start this program except one of the Taloda (Nandurbar) based college which was earlier affiliated University of Pune. The department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, Savitribai Phule Pune University has started the said course in the academic year 2012-13 as per old structure & syllabus content; The Ad-voc Board of Studies in Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, Savitribai Phule Pune University in its meeting held on 4th February 2014 had a agenda of the revision of syllabus of the Diploma in Tribal Development since it is running by the department and constituted provisional three member committee to review and decide the further course of action. The three member committee consisting of Dr. B. A. Deshmukh , Coordinator, Dr. Kailash Bawale and Dr. Samshodin Tamboli as members.

The committee has reviewed and revised the rules, regulations and evalution scheme with credit system with following objectives.

Objectives of the Course:-

The course is designed to train,

- 1. Development facilitators for working with tribal communities,
- 2. To be development facilitators in the field of tribal development
- 3. Development facilitators to have a adequate skills to prepare & implement integrated development plan & projects for tribal communities.
- 4. Development facilitators to develop understanding of good governance in the field of tribal development.
- 5. Development facilitators to be a competent change agent in the field of tribal development.

Modular based teachinglearning approach is a unique features of proposed course which will be evaluated in the credit form. The draft course structure along with rules, regulations and evaluation scheme was discussed in Board sub-Committee meeting and decided to have a workshop in the order to consult the experts working in the field of tribal development.

Introduction to workshop:-

It is known and accepted fact that planned development approach require trained manpower in tribal development field. Distinct features of tribal culture and consumption oriented economy hardly allow outside inputs and interference in their life and livelihoods pattern. However, constitutional and development value envisaged integration of tribal communities with other communities drive government and non-government organizations, educational institutions and spirited individuals to get involved & devote themeselves in tribal development in different capacity.

The proposed course of Pune University aims at imparting trainings to be 'Development Facilitators' in the field of tribal development with the aforesaid objectives to the course. The Organizer of the workshop Dr. B. A. Deshmukh draw an attention of experts towards various stages of tribal development in past for the current reference i.e.

- 1. Isolation to economic growth,
- 2. growth with equality,
- 3. basic needs,
- 4. sustainable development,
- 5. participatory development,

It was expected to work and evolve ideas on the lines of integration approach of tribal development instead of assimilation and isolation. In order to achieve the expected outcome following objectives of workshop were formulated.

Objectives of workshop:-

- Explore understanding on the concepts in Tribal Development.
- Explore trends in the field of Tribal Development.
- Provide input to a draft syllabus content on Tribal Development.
- Invite ideas and thoughts on University academic program on Tribal Development.
- Prepare pre-final draft/ outline of the course curriculum.

Expert Participants:-

Total in all 22 experts including internal faculty members and members of Board and committee were participated in the workshop. Expert participants were drawn from the diverse levels in the field of tribal development i-e; academicians, researchers, social workers, activists and NGO practitioners.

Consultative Workshop Methodology:-

Following methodology was followed in the workshop.

a) Presentations:-

Dr. Bipinjojo professor, Tata institute of social sciences Mumbai gave an outline of tribal development concerns. as under,

- Demographic distribution of tribal communities
- Approaches to understand Tribe,
- Criteria to be called Tribal & primitive Tribe,
- Policies and programmers of tribal development,
- Constitutional provisions,
- Cardinal principles (panchsheel) of tribal policy,
- Five year plans & Tribal development,
- Tribals& forest
- Land alienation
- Laws related to Tribal communities enacted by central government,
- Key areas to study Tribals.

Mohan HirabaiHiralal renowned social worker presented his views on natural resource management through tribal self rule. He emphasized on natural resource based tribal development. Removing inferiority complex, tribal judiciary system and self-rule were the prime concerns of tribal development which further he added. Dr. MilindBokil a Pune based academician and scholar drawn attention towards need of basic objective of the course and

the significant role which will be played by the trained graduates in the field as scholars, workers, administrators etc. and need of pedagogy to be decided and accepted. Dr. Kailas Bawale a development scholar expressed his views to have a interdisciplinary approach to attract the trainees from diverse field and discipline. Dr. Suresh pathare, social work Educator said that skill building frame of the curriculum should be developed for working with tribals and sustainable development. At the outset Dr. D. B. Lokhandepsoke about the department.

b) Discussion on Modular based curriculum:-

Post-lunch session was devoted to discussion & deliberations on modular based curriculum content prepared by host department. Six modules were proposed for discussion entitled, 1, Tribal society in India, 2, Development Issues of Tribals, 3, Approaches of Tribal development: planned development, 4, participatory Resource Management & Lifelong learning, 5, Tribal development Administration, 6, Research Methods in Tribal studies. Field practicum is independent component proposed to be developed. Each module has to have its learning objectives, topic, Learning areas, Teaching-learning methods & tools, periods & credits etc.

c) Round Table Discussion :-

Round table discussion was held to make some suggestions. It was face to face discussion by employing computer technology. following suggestions made by the experts were very valuable for future work.

Suggestions:-

As far as titles of the modules were concerned suggestions were as follows,

- 1. Module No-1 'Tribal society in India' be reframed as "Tribal Culture, Society and Livelihood".
- 2. Module No-2; Development Issues of Tribal community; be divided into two parts, i.e. 1) Conceptual Issues regards to development (Development Theories) and 2) Experience & evidence based issues of development (Actual issues)
- 3. Module No- 3; 'Approaches of Tribal Development: planned Development' may be clubbed with module No-5 i.e. Tribal Development Administration,
- 4. Module No-4, 'Participatory Resource Management and Lifelong Learning may be reframed as "Governance and Natural Resource Management;
- 5. Module No-6,'Research Methods in Tribal studies' should be retained. Thus, development issues of tribal communities will be developed under two parts which will be leading two independent modules.

Focus of program :-

- 1. 25% focus on understanding Tribal communities/tribes,
- 2. 75% focus on Development concepts, perspectives,
- 3. Tribal Development Administration,

Suggestions for content:-

- Tribal culture, society and development/Forest based/ sustainable
- Historical review of movements with reference to tribes in general
- Overview of Origin, historical analysis, Anthropological perspective
- Governance of tribal area/ scheduled areas
- Basic non representative participatory unit

- Life and livelihood
- Analysis of marginalization, Vulnerability and deprivation of tribal community
- Understanding learning and education process within tribal community
- Oral tradition
- Issues regards to Development vs Displacement, Rehabilitation
- Tribal identity, dignity
- Understanding constitutional safeguards, provisions, policy framework
- Classroom teaching to be complimented with field work and practicum
- Values and ethical concerns
- Philosophy and ideology for tribal development
- Management of natural resources (Forest, water, soil preservation, conservation)
- Experiments of Convergence of indigenous knowledge and modern science/technology
 - (e. g. vigyanghotul)
- Understanding scientific perspective
- Understanding tribal wisdom
- Skills required for working with tribal community-
 - Respect and relation/rapport building,
 - Analytical skills,
 - Research skills,
 - Advocacy,
 - Participatory Approaches
 - Facilitation skills
- Exposure to innovative field projects.

Future plan:-

On the basis of suggestions made by the expert participants process of development of course content has been started, second round of the discussion will be conducted probability in the month of October 2014.
